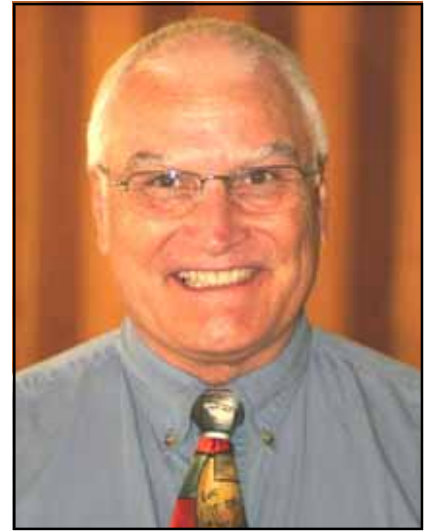




Spreading the Love of Christ to Others

In the movie *Witness* there is a beautiful scene in which the Amish community gathers at a family's home for an old-fashioned barn raising. It is inspiring to watch the building go up as everyone works together to get the job done. It is an example of the Christian community at its best — each member contributing their part to help meet a need.

It is also a vivid demonstration of the truth that we can accomplish much more together than we can on our own. That is one reason why I love being a United Methodist. Through The United Methodist Church, we are part of a larger community — we are connected to all other United Methodist churches throughout the world. Through our connectional system, we are able to accomplish much more ministry in the name of Jesus Christ than we could ever hope to accomplish on our own.

Apportionments are the fuel that makes it possible for the church to make a difference in the world. No one local church is responsible for establishing a university in Africa, supporting the work of the denomination's boards and agencies, supporting historically black colleges, or providing financial support for the education of ordained ministers. But every local church does contribute to all those missions and many others when they pay their apportioned amount.

For example, right here in our own Desert Southwest Conference, we are able to provide professional campus ministry at all four universities in our conference (Arizona State University, Northern Arizona University, University of Arizona, AND University of Nevada, Las Vegas). We provide redemptive and rehabilitative help for the homeless through United Methodist Outreach Ministries (UMOM) in Phoenix, Ariz., where homeless persons are housed and fed while they find work and get re-established as independent citizens in the community. Hot meals are also provided to those who are living on the streets through UMOM's soup kitchen.

Our Annual Conference Board of Global Ministries administers hunger funds to local ministries throughout our conference,

including United Methodist Social Ministries (UMSM) right here in Las Vegas. Through these ministries, all of the churches in our conference are helping to feed the hungry and providing aid for the poor in our own backyard.

The same thing is true on a national and international level. Candace (Lansberry, Rev. Dr.) and I were serving churches in southern California during the Northridge, Calif., earthquake several years ago. The very first relief agency to arrive on the scene to help the victims of that disaster was the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR)

— a ministry of our United Methodist connection. Last year and again this year UMCOR is among the leaders of the effort to help the victims of the earthquakes in Haiti, Chile and Japan. Through our apportionments, Trinity is there — ministering to these people in the name of Jesus Christ.

Through our connectional system, we are able to accomplish so much more for the glory of God than we could ever hope to do on our own. Sometimes, as the local church struggles to pay its own expenses and fund its local ministries, it becomes easy

to resent our apportionments and see them as a burden — until we remember that our apportionments represent *ministry* beyond our local church.

We really ought to celebrate when paying our apportionments because it means that we are bringing the love of Christ to more and more people than we could reach alone. We really ought to celebrate whenever our apportionments go up because that means God is moving through our United Methodist connection as we expand our outreach to a broken and hurting world.

Freshly Baked Pies Assist Families in Need

Scrumptious, freshly baked pies were purchased and enjoyed by many on Father's Day. The delicious treats were baked by the company, Pies Unlimited, and sold in a fundraiser by the Society of St. Stephen ministry team.

A total of \$655 was raised for the St. Stephen Helping Hand Up program. Through the program, families visiting the St. Stephen food pantry may seek assistance in paying one household bill that may prevent homelessness. St. Stephen volunteers carefully screen clients to consider submitting a referral to request payments be paid from available program funds.

While the maximum request is normally no more than \$100 per family, at times exceptions are made. For example, \$179.05 was paid recently to a weekly rental facility to prevent the immediate eviction of a young woman and her 2-year-old child. The single mother was most appreciative, often repeating, "Thank you so much!"

Donations to the Helping Hand Up program may be made by specifying the Pastor's Discretionary Fund as the contribution purpose.

Did you know that United Methodist Social Ministries (UMSM) is an independent 501C(3) nonprofit corporation which is overseen by a volunteer board of directors and achieves unqualified, audited financial statements each year?

As the outreach ministry of the United Methodist Church in the North District of the Desert Southwest Annual Conference, USMC operates the longest running weekend emergency food pantry in southern Nevada and is an accredited agency of the United Way of Southern Nevada. The organization is pleased that the food inventory has improved as a multi-year recipient of the U.S. Emergency Food and Shelter Program (EFSP) and as a partner with the state of Nevada USDA distribution program.

While they also appreciate the ongoing "in-kind" donations of churches and other community partners, the organization faces significant service cutbacks as cash contributions and fundraising have declined in contrast to the need for services. Please pray for continued operation in 2011.

In addition to supporting UMSM with monthly food donations, please remember that they are in need of regular weekend volunteers, data entry personnel, fundraising facilitators, and cash donations to support the Weekend Emergency Assistance Program, Fostering in Faith, Hats and Hands, and other UMSM programs.

Your food donations have helped tremendously, especially since the yearly grant from the federal Emergency Food & Shelter Program was not available to us this year. We always seem to be in need of breakfast items—cereal, pancake mix, syrup, etc. Also, donations of canned food items are always appreciated.

We also thank you for the financial donations we have received from members of your congregation. These donations have helped us pay for the costs of running UMSM—utilities, office supplies, and repayment of our Foundation Loan.

Hats and scarves have been coming in regularly. If donations continue as they have been, we should be in fine shape when the cold weather returns. We thank all those who knit and crochet for their time and donations.

We had about 60 people attend our Fostering in Faith Task Force training session, "Mood Disorders in Young Children," which was held June 14 at Griffith UMC. 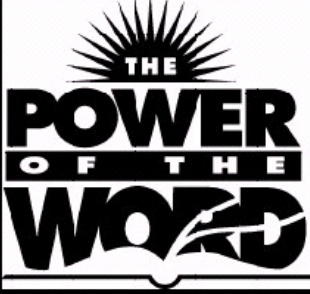
