As United Methodists, We Believe ...

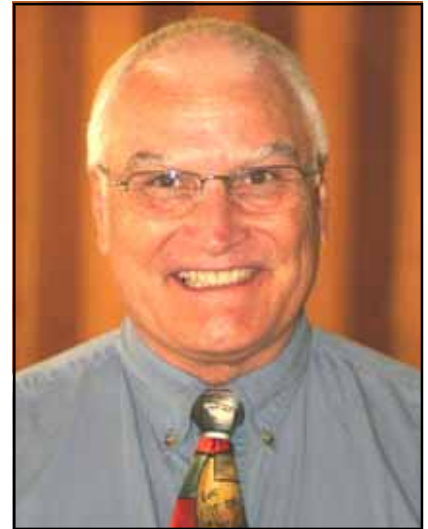

One of the things that I love about the United Methodist Church is our diversity. Not only are we diverse racially and culturally but we are also diverse theologically and politically. This is in keeping with our heritage as United Methodists.

At the death of George Whitefield, John Wesley wrote a memorial sermon which acknowledged but downplayed the two men's doctrinal differences: "There are many doctrines of a less essential nature . . . In these we may think and let think; we may 'agree to disagree.' But, meantime, let us hold fast the essentials..." Wesley was the first to put the phrase "agree to disagree" in print.

Just think. What other denomination can boast a membership as broad as Rush Limbaugh and Hillary Clinton? George McGovern and George W. Bush? Dick Cheney and John Edwards? Geronimo and Ulysses S. Grant? Jackie Robinson and Chiang Kai-Shek? George Lucas and Alistair Cooke? (To see more well-known Methodists, you can go to the Internet and search at www.adherents.com/largecom/fam_meth.html.)

Personally, I find it exhilarating to know that not everyone worshipping with me agrees with me 100 percent on every issue. My mind is stimulated by conversations with those whose views are differ-

ent from mine.

All of the prominent United Methodists mentioned share a common bond in Christ. They are part of an 11 million-strong global church that opens hearts, opens doors and opens minds through active engagement with our world.

John Wesley and the early Methodists placed primary emphasis on Christian living, on putting faith and love into action. United Methodists share the following basic affirmations in common with all Christian communities:

We describe God in three persons. Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are commonly used to refer to the threefold nature of God. Sometimes we use other terms, such as Creator, Redeemer, and Sustainer.

We believe that the Holy Spirit awakens us to God's will and empowers us to live obedi-

ently.

We believe that God created human beings in God's image.

We believe that humans can choose to accept or reject a relationship with God.

We believe that all humans need to be in relationship with God in order to be fully human.

We believe that the church is the body of Christ, an extension of Christ's life and ministry in the world today.

We believe that the mission of the church is to make disciples of Jesus Christ.

We believe that the church is "the communion of saints," a community made up of all past, present, and future disciples of Christ.

We believe that the church is called to worship God and to support those who participate in its life as they grow in faith.

We believe that the Bible is God's Word.

We believe that the Bible is the primary authority for our faith and practice.

We believe that Christians need to know and study the Old Testament and the New Testament (the Hebrew Scriptures and the Christian Scriptures).

We believe that the kingdom or reign of God is both a present reality and future hope.

We believe that wherever God's will is done, the kingdom or reign of God is present. It was present in Jesus' ministry, and it is also present in our world whenever persons and communities experience reconciliation, restoration, and healing.

We believe that the fulfillment of God's kingdom—the complete restoration of creation—is still to come.

We believe that the church is called to be both witness to the vision of what God's kingdom will be like and a participant in helping to bring it to completion.

We believe that the reign of God is both personal and social. Personally, we display the kingdom of God as our hearts and minds are transformed and we become more Christ-like.

Socially, God's vision for the kingdom includes the restoration and transformation of all of creation.

Caring Ministries Reaches Out

The Members of the Caring Ministry team would like to share one of the programs available to the Trinity congregation. On Sundays when communion is served at the 9 and 10:30 a.m. worship services, members of the team visit the home-bound with prayer and the communion elements for those who cannot attend church.

Several days before Communion Sunday, the Care Ministry team attempts to contact members of the congregation who may not be able to attend worship services. If parishioners request to receive in-home communion, a member of Caring Ministries usually drops by for a short visit sometime after the 10:30 service. It's a bless-

Thank you for paying 100% of your 2009 apportionments. Your payment of apportionments reflects a commitment to the ministry and mission of the entire church. Trinity to Host Tending the Soul



The time is finally here. Volunteers from the congregation have been secured, planning has been completed and Trinity UMC is ready for participants who have signed up for the "Tending the Soul During Conflict" training set for Saturday, March 6.

The Desert Southwest Conference sponsors the one-day experiential training designed to help lay and clergy persons better bring spiritual growth to the work of their churches. The event will take place from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

There has been a positive response to previous Tending the Soul events. Over 80 persons attended the last event in Casa Grande, Ariz. One of the questions that often surfaced from the feedback was, "How do I do this in my church?" The conference has taken that question to heart and is building practice into each of these events.

In the event in Arizona, the day was led by Richard Fincher and two other representatives

from JustPeace, a national organization for mediation and conflict transformation that is affiliated with The United Methodist Church.

Participants learned of the sources of conflict and the damage it can do. Through the use of case studies, the group gained strategies for dealing with conflict in a healthy and Christian manner. Small group conversations among participants helped the group to reflect on their own stories with one another.

This day of fellowship and growth for the whole Las Vegas Valley also will be crucial to attaining Trinity UMC goals set last year at the Annual Church Conference.

Richard Fincher, a professional mediator and affiliate of the organization JustPeace, will again lead the training in discovering how to make the practice of working through conflict a spiritual practice for our congregations.

The church office has a regular supply of light bulbs, toner

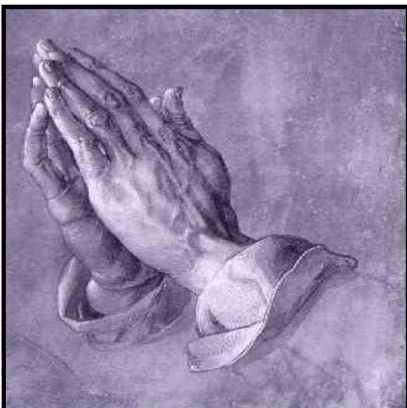
cartridges and computer stuff over and above the aluminum cans that are recycled to raise money for the youth fund.

Established in 1977, Safe Nest is Clark County's largest and most comprehensive agency devoted solely to domestic violence issues. Services include shelters in confidential locations, a 24-hour crisis hotline, counseling, victim advocacy, prevention and community education.

Although life in a shelter may not be an ideal situation, the organization strives to make shelters as welcoming as

possible, assisting mothers and their children with basic needs to ensure a comfortable stay. In January, Safe Nest Children's coordinators dispensed over 2,000 diapers to mothers in the shelter. This was an average month. If women have any source of income they are more than happy to purchase their own diapers, but for those who cannot, the shelter provides them.

With the shelter's supply running low, Safe Nest is in

dire need of diapers for babies and toddlers. The organization seeks support in the form of donations or a "divine diaper drive" for babies and toddlers in the shelter.

Drawing from the concept of God's ONE voice and his ONE great sacrifice, this original music cantata is both uplifting and intensely stirring, as the story

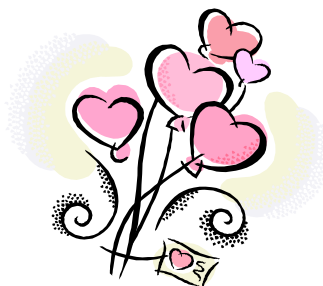

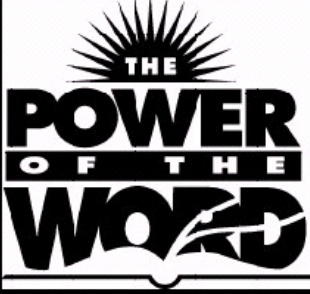
